



## How can the CDP Positively Influence the Local Economy?

One of the more challenging facets of the CDP is its role in strengthening and revitalizing the local economy to reach the Community's Values and Vision. Part of the challenge lies in the fact that the CDP is a County plan, and the County has limited influence and jurisdiction over economic factors. For this reason, the Economic section will focus primarily on Community-Based Collaborative recommendations. After a careful review of various economic development strategies, Community-Based Economic Development (CBED) strategies were found to be the best fit to revitalize the local economy because this approach is initiated at the Community level and engages residents directly in shaping their economic future.





Below are some **highlights** from the draft Local Economic Analysis Appendix:

- Agriculture: If just 5% of Planning Area spending went to local food purchases, approximately \$1.7 million would stay in the Planning Area.
- Renewable Energy: Small scale applications of renewable energy will play a supporting role for sectors such as agriculture and construction.
- Health & Wellness: The number of health service workers in Hawai'i is forecasted to increase nearly 54% between 2007-2035.
- **Visitor Industry:** Repeat visitors to Hawai'i have a higher preference and demand for authentic experiences and engagement with residents and local culture.
- Construction: Since 1980, residential growth in the Planning Area has been slower than the rest of the County; it has accounted for less than 5% of the Island's population growth.
